The crowded garage

For many years, we have used our small garage to store all items needed for daily operations of our shelter. This meant that we could only buy enough food and supplies for a few days or week at a time. From cat litter and food to cleaning supplies and blankets, we had very little space. This also meant that we spend a lot of staff time going to and from the stores to purchase needed items each week. We also pay for an offsite storage unit to keep other items that we may not need every day like event supplies, holiday items, extra crates and more.

We always wanted a large pole building that would allow us to store items appropriately. We could

buy things in bulk to save money, be more efficient with staff time and more. Well, in fall of 2016 we got a chance to apply for a grant that could make our dream a reality. Portage APL applied for a \$50,000 grant from the Burton D. Morgan Foundation (BDMF) to build a 24 x 40 foot pole building. In early 2017, we were told that we had been selected and would receive \$50,000 in honor of their 50 year anniversary to build this much-needed structure!!! What a wonderful gift!!

We were awarded the funds in the spring and planned to build over the summer and fall. Like most construction projects, weather and many other factors effect the plans. Although there were some weather and permit delays, our beautiful building was finished in early winter.

After the Thanksgiving holiday we invited BDMF President and CEO, Deb Hoover and Senior

Program Officer, Angela Evens to help us commemorate their extraordinary gift with a ribbon cutting ceremony. The weather was blustery and cold but it could not dampen our spirits. Protected with coat, hats and gloves, some staff and board members made it official when Deb Hoover cut the ribbon.

This building could not have become a reality without this grant. We never imagined it would happen and the Burton D Morgan Foundation made a dream come true for Portage APL.



Spay and Neuter Services for Cats

Low cost spay and neuter services are a very important part of helping stop pet overpopulation and unwanted animals entering shelters or being euthanized. At Portage APL, we work hard to do our part. Although we don't have our own clinic, we do host a mobile clinic that comes to our location to offer these services. We use **N.O.M.A.D.** who offers a variety of services. Every animal adopted from the APL is spayed or neutered. Please call us to schedule an appointment. We offer one or two clinics each month. We also sell Friends of Animals certificates (for cats and dogs) that can be used at many local veterinarians. We also have humane traps that people can borrow to trap stray or feral cats to bring in to be spayed or neutered.

As many of you know, cats need to be altered in order to prevent a continued increase in stray and feral cat populations. Getting your cat or a neighborhood cat fixed can be very costly and we want to make it possible for as many people as we can.

So, with these funds we will host two mobile clinics focused on community cats. The cost will be \$20 per cat and will include a rabies vaccine.

About 160 people enjoyed a variety of wine and food as well as over a hundred auction items and raffles too!





Winter Weather Brought Many New Animals to the APL

The winter of 2017-18 started off with extreme temperatures and dangerous conditions for people and animals. Portage APL's humane officer received a large number of reports of animals (mostly dogs) being kept outside without appropriate shelter. She also received emergency calls regarding animals dumped in the cold.

Many days the high temperatures only reached into the single digits and lows were in the negative with wind chills. Many animals cannot survive these temperatures even with appropriate shelter and insulation. We always recommend bringing animals indoors or at least out of the elements if possible.

We rescued 3 kittens who were tossed from a moving car on a day where the forecasted temperatures were not above 20 degrees and another cat that was hit by a car. They are all well and many have since been adopted. We also took in many stray cats that were at risk of frostbite and had nowhere to go.

We also seized 10 dogs within a two week period from owners who were not providing them with appropriate shelter or could not care for them properly. Many of the dogs didn't have shelter at all and many were underweight and shivering.

Portage APL would not be able to do our life-saving work without donations from the community and support from so many! Some of the lives saved are pictured here and we thank each and every one who had made it possible.

Leadership Circle

In 2010, Portage APL established *Leadership Circle*. Membership is granted to donors who provide financial support to Portage APL by contributing \$1,000 or more annually. *Leadership Circle "Life Member"* status is granted when you reach the \$5,000 mark.

Contributions from *Leadership Circle* members help nearly a thousand animals who come to the shelter each year because they have been injured, abused, surrendered, or abandoned. These animals receive food, shelter, and medical care for as long as needed until each adoptable animal finds a "forever home."

Leadership Circle funds also support humane investigations. Reports of abandonment, cruelty, and neglect reach into the thousands. Contributions are also used to educate the public about the responsibilities of pet ownership and to offer low-cost spay and neuter clinics that help reduce pet overpopulation.

Why Leadership Circle is Important?

As a private, 501(c)(3) non-profit organization, we rely on the generosity of the community to make our important work possible.

It costs more than \$1,500 per day to operate our facility and care for almost a thousand animals we rescue each year.

Each animal adopted is current on vaccines, checked for disease, spayed or neutered, and free of fleas and worms. Portage APL is proud to do so much for so many

Humane law enforcement is a daily necessity. Thousands of calls have been answered and so many animals saved. It is our mission to uphold humane laws and help the victims start over.
